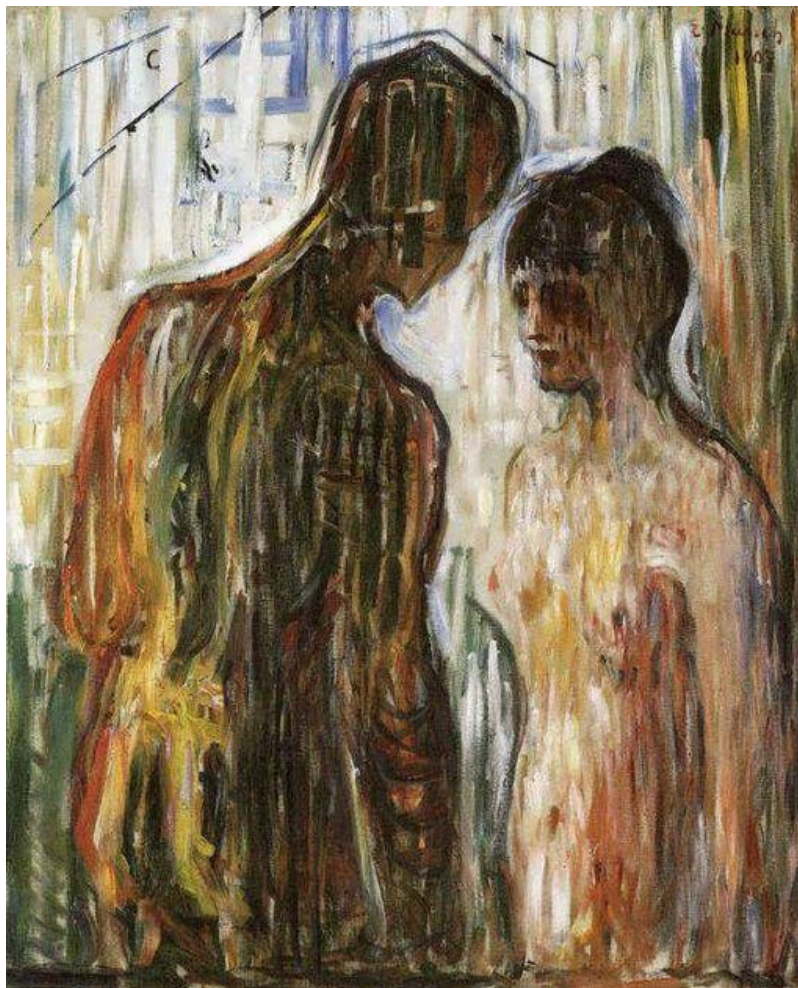


**Estonian Society for Analytical Psychology invites to open lectures on erotic transference/countertransference, narcissism and sexual identities**

## Biography

Martin Schmidt, MBPsS, is a Jungian Training Analyst of the Society of Analytical Psychology, London. He has worked as a psychologist and psychotherapist in psychiatric rehabilitation for over 20 years with patients suffering from psychosis, narcissistic and borderline personality disorders. Until August 2019, he was the Honorary Secretary of the International Association for Analytical Psychology (IAAP) and its Regional Organizer for Central Europe.



He teaches and supervises widely both in the UK and internationally. His paper '*Psychic Skin: psychotic defences, borderline process and delusions*' (JAP, Feb 2012, Vol 57, no 1) won the Fordham prize for best clinical paper in 2012 and was nominated for the Gradiva award by the National Association for the Advancement of Psychoanalysis in New York in 2013.

## Programme

**Friday, April 24<sup>th</sup> 2020**

**17.00-20.00 Erotic transference/countertransference**

This seminar will explore the dynamics of erotic transference and countertransference in the clinical encounter from both Jungian and Freudian perspectives. Particular consideration is given to the difference between eroticized and erotic transference and how this conceptual distinction can support our understanding of how to work with the erotic.

**Saturday, April 25<sup>th</sup> 2020**

**10.00-11.30 Narcissism**

This seminar will explore the development of the concept of narcissism and how it has come to underpin our understanding of all pathology. Particular attention is given to an understanding of narcissistic personality disorder and how to work with this condition analytically. Drawing upon Freud's seminal paper on 'Narcissism an introduction' (1914) and the myth of Echo and Narcissus, archetypal transference dynamics of working with narcissism are examined.

## **11.45-13.30 Sexual Identities**

This seminar explores the centrality of sexuality in the formation of identity. Consideration is given to understanding the relationship between biological sex, gender identity and sexual orientation in clinical practice. Using case examples, some of the dynamics inherent in working with diverse sexual identities in analysis are examined.
